



## Gus Noble to Receive 2021 National Tartan Day Award



### Gus R. Noble

Gus Noble was born in Dundee, Scotland, and graduated from the University of Stirling in 1992. After graduation he moved to Chicago and worked for the British Consulate General for seven years before establishing the first international office of the Welsh Assembly Government in Chicago which he led for five years. In August 2004, Gus was named president of the Chicago Scots and Caledonia Senior Living and Memory Care. His civic role includes serving on the boards of the Admiral at the Lake, the oldest elder care community in Chicago, and the Rosehill Cemetery Reserve Fund, which governs the cemetery where Chicago Scots owns more than 600 plots and many Scots are buried. He supports Newcastle United Football Club and plays electric bass guitar in a Scottish-American honky-tonk band. He and his wife, Aisha, have two sons, Bobby and Langston. Many Scottish-Americans know Gus for his 17-year commitment to growing the Scottish North American Community Conference, started in 2003, to enhance understanding, communication and cooperation within the Scottish North American community. Going forward many Scots will





### **FLOWER FUND ELIGIBILITY & NOTIFICATION PROCEDURE**

The St. Andrew's Society of Detroit Executive Board has agreed to the following:

#### **ELIGIBILITY:**

- Death of member or spouse receives flowers at funeral home. If late, send to the home.
- Death of other immediate family members, member receives card (i.e., father, mother, child).
- Member is hospitalized, flowers are sent to the hospital, or, if released, to the home. Spouse receives card if hospitalized. Hospitalization covers surgery, whether emergency or planned; birth of baby; illness.

#### **NOTIFICATION:**

- Member or representative should send an email to [secondvp@detroitscots.com](mailto:secondvp@detroitscots.com). Officer (2nd VP or President) will gather pertinent details and determine whether or not member wishes information to be sent out in an Eblast.
- Officer will notify Flower Coordinator, Pam Thomson, who will send flowers/card as appropriate.
- Flower arrangements not to exceed \$70+delivery for a funeral and \$50+delivery for a hospital. If member designates charity in lieu of flowers, Flower Coordinator Pam Thomson will notify the Society Treasurer.
- Officer also will notify FLING Editor (if message is to be Eblast), Society Chaplain, and Membership Secretary for Society records. If event has already taken place, this procedure will still be followed.



And in Chris Guthrie, Grassic Gibbon has given us one of literature's most unforgettable heroines.
