Welcome Inn provides warm and nutritious meals that are prepared and served onsite, 3 times daily. On average, Welcome Inn volunteers serve over 10,000 meals every season. It clothes hundreds of men and women each season via an onsite clothing closet that is stocked with donated items. With the help of volunteers from a variety of denominations, guests have access to services that promote their spiritual wellness. Guests have access to an onsite social-worker and to volunteer nurses.
