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A Letter from the President



Kincaid Scholarship



The St. Andrew's Society of Detroit is very proud of its Kincaid Scholarship program that couldn't exist without participation, support, and volunteers from the Society's membership, and from the Highland Games Raffle ticket sales. Thank you for helping to keep our Scottish traditions and heritage alive!

The Society provides a number of scholarship grants to students and instructors studying and teaching the Scottish arts. The program offers modest scholarships for pipers, drummers, Highland dancers, harpists (clarsach) and fiddlers to further their interest and improve their skills. Scholarships are given for a variety of schools, camps, clinics, workshops and Scottish Arts experiences as approved by the Kincaid Scholarship program, the Trustees and the Benevolence Committee.

Here is some background on the Kincaid Scholarship. William (Bill) H. Kincaid joined St. Andrew's Society of Detroit in December 1985 and is a current member. He chaired the Highland Games at Historic Fort Wayne in 1988. He served as Society Treasurer and served as President 1991-1992. In 1994, having been involved in Highland Dance lessons with his own family and friends, he suggested that the Society establish a Scholarship Fund to encourage young people to get involved and participate in our Highland Games. He ran the Scholarship program for many years. In 2003, the Society renamed the Scholarship program to honor Bill Kincaid and his wonderful contributions to the Society.

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

The book for our April discussion was *Kidnapped* by Robert Louis Stevenson.

<u>Description:</u> Tricked by the uncle who has stolen his inheritance, young David Balfour is kidnapped and bound for America. Or at least that was the plan, until the ship runs into trouble and David is rescued by Alan Breck Stewart, fugitive Jacobite and, by his own admission, a 'bonny fighter'. Balfour, a canny Lowlander, finds an echo of some wilder and more romantic self in the willful and courageous Highland spirit of Alan Breck. A strange and difficult friendship is born, as their adventures begin.

Kidnapped is a classic of historical romance and is justly famous as a novel of travel and adventure in the Scottish landscape. Stevenson's vivid descriptive powers were never better than in his account of remote places and dangerous action in the Highlands in the years after Culloden.

Review: We found it interesting to "see" Scotland in the period shortly after events of 1745 and how Lowlanders, Highlanders, and Englishmen of that period thought about and treated each other. The description of the country itself was full of detail but we would have liked a map to help trace David's journeys. (We found one on Wikipedia.) It is an adventure story, so of course there were fight scenes with swords and guns, but where else would you find a "fight" where the contestants used bagpipes? We read old copies, new copies, ebooks, and audiobook versions of this story and all enjoyed it. We highly recommend this title.


