

# Off The Shelf... Celebrating the Charles S. Low Memorial Library

#### **Black History Month**

The Low Memorial Library is recommending the book *As Good as Any Man: Scotland's Black Tommy* written by Morag Miller, Roy Laycock, John Sadler, and Rosie Serdiville for Black History Month (or for any month). The book covers the experiences of Arthur Roberts, a Scottish black serviceman during World War I. Based on Arthur's diaries and research, the book details what life was like for Arthur during the war. It includes his experiences in the trenches and in the Battle of Passchendaele. I found the book enjoyable with descriptions of daily war life to be especially meaningful since my grandfather, like Arthur, was from Glasgow and served in the British military during the Great War.

As Good as Any Man . . . was donated to the Low Library by Xavier Allen. Members may recognize Xavier, since he is the Drum Major for the Mass Bands event during our Highland Games opening ceremonies. With the support of Bill Kincaid, he became a member of the St. Andrew's Society of Detroit in April 1994 at the age of 28. Xavier has a passion for history and genealogy. With his grandmother's help, Lillian Gadson, he has been able to trace his ancestry back generations to clans Henderson, Holland, Gordon, and Gadson. His great grandfather, Isaac Gadson, immigrated to the U.S. from the British Virgin Islands after 1900 to be a teacher.

Xavier has embraced Scottish culture. Not only is he an established Drum Major, but he is also a highland dancer, plays the tenor and bass drum, and has served as the St. Andrew's Society of Detroit historian and archivist. Thank you, Xavier, for your long-time membership in St. Andrew's Society of Detroit and for the book donation.


