
There are two ways to become a Life Member:



Off The Shelf... News from the Charles S. Low Memorial Library

St. Andrew's Archival Committee is an all-volunteer group headed by Dennis Clements. It is responsible for the intake of materials, organizing, preserving, and cataloging the best Society's historical documents. This includes practices handling for materials such as original membership books bound in leather, digitization techniques, and creating accessible finding aids. Proper preservation is essential requiring acid-free boxes and folders which meet the requirement standards of NARA and keeping the storage temperature and humidity at proper levels. To these ends, we have been assisted by the expertise of the archivist at Clark Historical Library at Central Michigan University and work with St. Andrew's artifacts already cataloged at the Burton Historical Collection. By supporting the archives program, we are able to ensure that our records are preserved and are available to provide the work of staff and the research needs of our members as well as any outside interest from the local communities and the public. The goal of the Archives Committee is to have our records housed in an online database which will offer quick access to the St. Andrew's Society of Detroit's archives.

Charles S. Low Book Club

For our November book discussion, we will be reading *How to Kill a Witch: a Guide for the Patriarchy* by Claire Mitchell and Zoe Venditozzi.

Description:



Scotland. 1563: Crops failed. People And the starved. Devil's influence was stronger than ever, at least, that's what everyone believed. If you were a woman living in Scotland during this turbulent time, there was a very good chance that you, or someone you knew, would be tried as a witch. Witch hunts ripped through the country for over 150 years, with at least 4,000 accused, and with many women's fates sealed by a grizzly execution of strangulation, followed by burning.

During the chaos of the Reformation, violence against women was codified for the first time in the Witchcraft Act—a tool of theocratic control with one chilling goal: to root out witches and rid the land of evil. What followed was a dark and misogynistic chapter in history that fanned the flames of witch hunts across the globe, including the United States and beyond. In order to understand why it happened, they have broken down the entire horrifying process, step-by-step, from identification of individuals, to their accusation, "pricking", torture, confessions, execution and beyond.

This captivating (and often infuriating) account, which weaves a rich tapestry of trial transcripts, witness accounts, and the documents that set the legal grounds for the witch hunts, exposes how this violent period of history mirrors today's struggles for justice and equality. How to Kill a Witch is a powerful, darkly humorous reminder of the dangers of superstition, bias, and ignorance, and a warning to never forget the past... while raising the question of whether it could ever happen again.

(The American edition will be published on September 30, but you can get the British edition from Amazon, Alibris, or other booksellers if you can't wait.)


