OUR BENEVOLENCES

I am sure all of you are as pleased as I am to be coming out of the deep freeze of winter. Maybe the warmer weather will inspire you to do some clearing out of gently used clothing and household items for our March Charity! Even a few items help as collectively we can fill a vehicle with donations each month.

Our March charity is [Turning Point Secondhand Rose](#) in Mt. Clemens. They are celebrating 46 years of service to helping women that are victims of domestic violence, sexual violence and human trafficking. Ninety cents of every dollar donated goes directly to programming to support survivors. All Turning Point services are free. Only new items are provided to survivors in the shelter and housing program. Gently used items are donated to Turning Point Second Hand Rose resale shop. Survivors are given vouchers to get items they need at no charge in the resale shop. It is also open to the public with all proceeds benefiting Turning Point survivor services. Please bring your gently used clothing and household items to our March meeting. If, you would like to purchase new items, they have a wish list on Amazon. Or use it as a guide to find similar items elsewhere.

The Kilgour Centre Fund Drive

Saving our Kilgour Scottish Centre

Thank you very much to our donors! As of this March's *Fling* \$26,317.47 has been donated to maintain our Kilgour Scottish Centre. We're at 44% of our \$60,000 goal. Reaching \$60,000 by September 1, 2026, is a reach but, it's very obtainable, depending on members' generosity. Presently, only 17% of members or roughly 80 members have donated. For those who have donated so far, thank you. For those who have not yet donated, your help is vitally important for maintaining and keeping our Kilgour Scottish Centre. That is a reality!

Since 2024, the Society has had to deal with a little over \$172,000 in unscheduled, unbudgeted repairs to the hall, from a new roof to fireplace repairs and frozen water pipe repairs as a few examples. A badly needed MiniSplit Heat/AC unit is being installed in the office. That will cost \$8,000 to \$9,000. To inspect the Heating/AC ductwork to determine what needs to be done for the bathrooms is another \$3,000, to \$4,000. Depending on what is found, the solutions needed could be expensive. Fortunately, for the generosity of those who have already donated, it is intended that these items will be paid for without dipping into our investment funds further.

Every member is encouraged to support the **Kilgour Fund Drive**. Over the next six months you may choose to donate **\$34 monthly**, **\$67 quarterly**, or make a **one-time gift of \$200**. If that level isn't feasible right now, please know that **every donation, of any amount, is sincerely appreciated**.



Kim's Korner - The Legacy Society

March 2026

Topic: Planned Giving versus Legacy Planning

The Lowdown: Often, when we think about being charitable with our finances, not a lot of thought is put into the “how” ... it’s usually just about the “how much”. I’d like to spend a bit of time this month talking about the “how” and why not all donations are the same.

Planned Giving is the term used to describe the idea of developing a strategy of charitable gifts while one is still alive. You will often see this used during stewardship campaigns in religious communities, capital fundraising campaigns in an organization where there is a plan to raise funds for a specific goal. What makes Planned Giving unique is the tax-deductibility of these charitable donations when given to a qualifying charity in that calendar year.

Legacy Planning is the term used to describe this same idea of strategic charitable giving, just after one has died. You will often see this used in organizations where longevity is important such as a cultural organization or university. What makes Legacy Planning unique is the lack of immediate tax-deductibility since no money is being donated now, it’s just the promise of that donation after one’s death to ensure your wealth is managed in a way that reflects your beliefs.

Fun Fact: All legacy planning is considered planned giving, but not all planned giving is legacy planning.

In Short: If you are looking for a current year tax deduction and have surplus funds not required to support your lifestyle...Planned Giving may be of interest to you. If you are looking to support an organization after your death, and current year tax deductions are not your primary concern, Legacy Planning may be of interest to you.


